The Role of the Peer Mentor



Academic Support and Skill Development

Peer mentors focus on the development of academic skills including time management, organization, and communication



Social And Emotional Support

Peer mentors encourage student participation in campus events and support students with accommodation requests for campus events.



Support with Self-Advocacy and Empowerment

Peer mentors support student understanding of their strengths, their rights, and how to effectively communicate their needs.
